CIRCULAR ORDER. 16-21 ✓

It is observed by the I.C. of Police that District Superintendents of Police very often ask for extra Police Force from their Range Head Quarters or the neighbouring districts and when the same is supplied to them they keep that force posted in their districts for indefinite period even without any genuine cause. This results in sheer waste of man-power and is highly objectionable.

It is, therefore, enjoined upon all the District Supdts. of Police and the others concerned that the requisition for extra Police Force should only be made in express emergency when the situation in the district so warrants. The District Superintendents of Police who makes requisition for extra force should clearly specify the period for which the extra force is required, and action should be taken by him to return the force by due date or soon after the emergency ceases to exist. The posting of the extra force during emergency should be at ~~strategic~~ strategic points and under the direct supervision of the S.P. from time to time. As and when the posting of the extra force is not considered necessary in the district it should be withdrawn and despatched to its parent unit. In case the emergency continues beyond the period specified in first instance, the permission of the I.C. of Police through the D.I.G. Range to retain the force for a further period should invariably be sought furnishing genuine reasons.

The idea of issuing this circular is primarily to restrict frequent demands for extra force and ~~secondarily~~ secondarily to ensure its proper utilisation during the specified period.
