STANDING ORDER NO. 3.

Sub: Prompt communication of information to
the I.G.P., C.I.D. and Range D.Is.G.P.

There is no order in existence at present
specifying incidents about which prompt information
should be submitted by Districts to the I.G.P., C.I.D.
and Range D.Is.G.P. The following orders are therefore
issued for the guidance of all District Superintendents
of Police and Commandants of R.A.C. Bns.

Prompt information ^{in writing or} if necessary by telephone,
telegraph or wireless, should always be sent by District
Superintendents of Police ^{and} Commandants R.A.C. Bns. to
the I.G.P. and Range D.Is.G.P. whenever incidents of
the following nature occur within their respective
charges:

(a) Civil or criminal suits filed against any
Police Officer or man either by the Police themselves or
by private persons. These reports should invariably
be followed by progress reports until the cases are
decided by the courts. ~~concerned.~~

(b) Motor accidents in which Police Department
vehicles or personnel are involved. This should contain
full details of the accident and ~~should~~ clearly show
who ^{is or are} ~~were~~ responsible for ^{it.} ~~them~~. If any injuries are
received by Police personnel or any damage occurs to
the Police Department vehicles, full details should be
given.

(c) Any other accident or incident in which
Police personnel is involved, for instance accidental
blowing off of a gun or rifle injuring a Police Officer
or man etc. Full details should be given of the
incident.

(d) Any serious sickness (involving surgical
