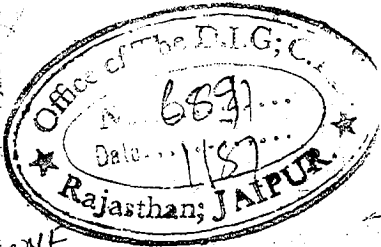

STANDING ORDER NO. 4...

Subject:- Personal investigation by District Superintendents of Police (including Railways) and Circle Officers.

.....

Cases which come to notice from time to time have clearly shown that the main reason why the quality of our investigation is poor is that superior officers like Superintendents of Police and Circle Officers are themselves weak in it and are therefore unable to guide their subordinates effectively and efficiently.

1. It is ~~therefore~~ hereby ordered that every Superintendent of Police (including Railways), in charge of District should ^{until further instructions,} ~~hereafter~~ personally investigate at least three serious offences every year i.e. ^{roughly} one every four months. This personal investigation should be ^{exactly} on the same lines as those indicated for direct A.Ss.P. and Dy.Ss.P. in this office ^x Standing Order No. 4 dated 14. 3. 57. The definition of "serious offence" is also the same as given in the above Standing Order.

2. It is ^{further} also ordered that every promoted Dy.S.P. should also investigate three serious offences as above every year.

3. Both the District Superintendents of Police and promoted Dy.Ss.P. should send the case diaries of the offences they personally investigate to their Range D.Is. who will carefully go through them and issue such checks as are necessary from time to time.

4. This order does not apply to directly recruited A.Ss.P. and Dy.Ss.P. who will be governed by the above mentioned Standing Order. This means that they will investigate six offences instead of three every year.

5. As four months of the current year are already over, the District Superintendents of Police (including Railways) and promoted Dy.Ss.P. should investigate two serious offences this year instead of three. From next year they will
